Evangelism: What is the Good News?

Goals: to define what "The Gospel" means **and** learn how to communicate it more fully when sharing it with others.

Openers:

- Share about a time you received some good news (can be recently or a long time ago).
- From what you know about Jesus, what is something about Him his character, his life, his teachings that seems like really good news for you personally.

Scripture Activity:

The goal of this activity is to get a broader definition of the gospel and to give us easily accessible stories to tell others as we seek to help them understand what the gospel is.

<u>Step 1</u>: Split your Core up into 4 smaller groups. Depending on the size of your Core, it could be pairs or 3's or some other number.

<u>Step 2</u>: Give each group one of the following stories from the Gospels:

Luke 7:18-23 Messengers from John the Baptist Luke 15:11-32 The Prodigal Son John 8:2-11 The Woman Caught in Adultery Mark 10:17-31 The Rich Young Ruler

*If you Core is super small, you can split the group in half and give each group 2 of the stories.

<u>Step 3</u>: Have each group read their story out loud to each other and answer this question together: **After reading this story, how would you define the gospel?**

*Give the groups 10-15 minutes to read their story and discuss

<u>Step 4</u>: Gather everyone back and have each group read their story out loud & report out to the whole group what they found out about the gospel. Write each group's response on a big piece of paper or a white board.

Digging Deeper Together (Group Discussion Questions):

 Looking at our definition of the Gospel so far, are there any aspects of the Good News that we missed? (Think of other stories from the gospels or Jesus' teachings that help fill out the picture)

*Add these to your list on paper or whiteboard

- From these scriptures, we see that Jesus has a message to proclaim and restoration work to do in peoples' lives. How is this similar or different from what you have understood the gospel to be?
- What aspects of sharing this message seem exciting? Seem challenging? Seem likely to resonate with others?

Closing: PICK ONE

• Who is someone you know that you can share the good news with? Who is someone you are currently sharing the good news with?

Pray for them together - pray for them by name, that the Lord would use us to communicate His good news to them, and give us boldness to share His story with them.

• Read Revelation 21:1-5 out loud together.

These verses give us a picture of what life will be like when all things are finally & fully restored.

Invite 2-3 people close in prayer in response to Revelation 21:1-5
